



American Fence & Flag

When driving down Eberhart Road in Whitehall, you can't miss the gigantic U.S. flag that adorns the side of the American Fence & Flag building. This enormous 30' x 50' flag, the largest hanging flag in the Lehigh Valley, stretches almost as tall and as long as the office building.

Harold Mante founded what evolved into American Fence & Flag in 1983. The business truly is a family operation, with wife Joyce handling administrative duties, while daughter Jenne and son-in-law Tyler are in sales. Sadly, they lost a son, James, at the age of 14.

The enormity of that flag hanging on the building mirrors the philanthropic and community-minded spirit of the couple.

They stand by the business' stated purpose - to glorify and trust in God by being faithful stewards of all that has been entrusted to this company - and since 2001, have given 1% of gross sales and 10% of net profit to a variety of non-profits.

"We focus on organizations with Christian values and/or those which directly help people who are challenged in some way," Joyce stated. "That's why we support Fellowship. As a faith-based senior living community, their values align with ours."

American Fence & Flag and the Mante family have been giving to Fellowship for well over a decade.

"We appreciate their Christ-like compassion and caring, and the fact that the Spirit Fund (charitable care) ensures that residents are not forced to leave Fellowship if they run out of resources."

Giving Strategy



Donors often wonder about the best ways to give back to their communities and support causes they care about. One often overlooked tax-wise strategy is making charitable donations directly from an Individual Retirement Account (IRA). Known as Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCDs), these gifts offer a unique opportunity to make a difference while reaping tax benefits.

A QCD, also known as an IRA Charitable Rollover or IRA Charitable Distribution, is a distribution from your taxable IRA to a qualified charity or charities. It allows individuals who are age 70 ½ or older to now donate up to \$108,000 (adjusted for tax year 2025) each year. It may also count toward required minimum

distributions (RMDs) for people who are age 73 under current rules. A QCD is not taxed, nor is it included in taxable income.

This strategy is especially beneficial if:

- **You are over the age of 70½.**
- **You are age 73 or older and must take RMDs but do not necessarily need the extra income.**
- **You want to lower your taxable income while still supporting charitable causes.**

Using QCDs to make charitable contributions is a smart way to reduce your tax liability while supporting organizations and causes

close to your heart. Whether you are looking to manage your RMDs or simply want to give more effectively, this strategy can help you maximize the impact of your philanthropy.

Before making any decisions, consult with your financial advisor or tax professional to ensure that a QCD aligns with your broader financial and philanthropic goals.




